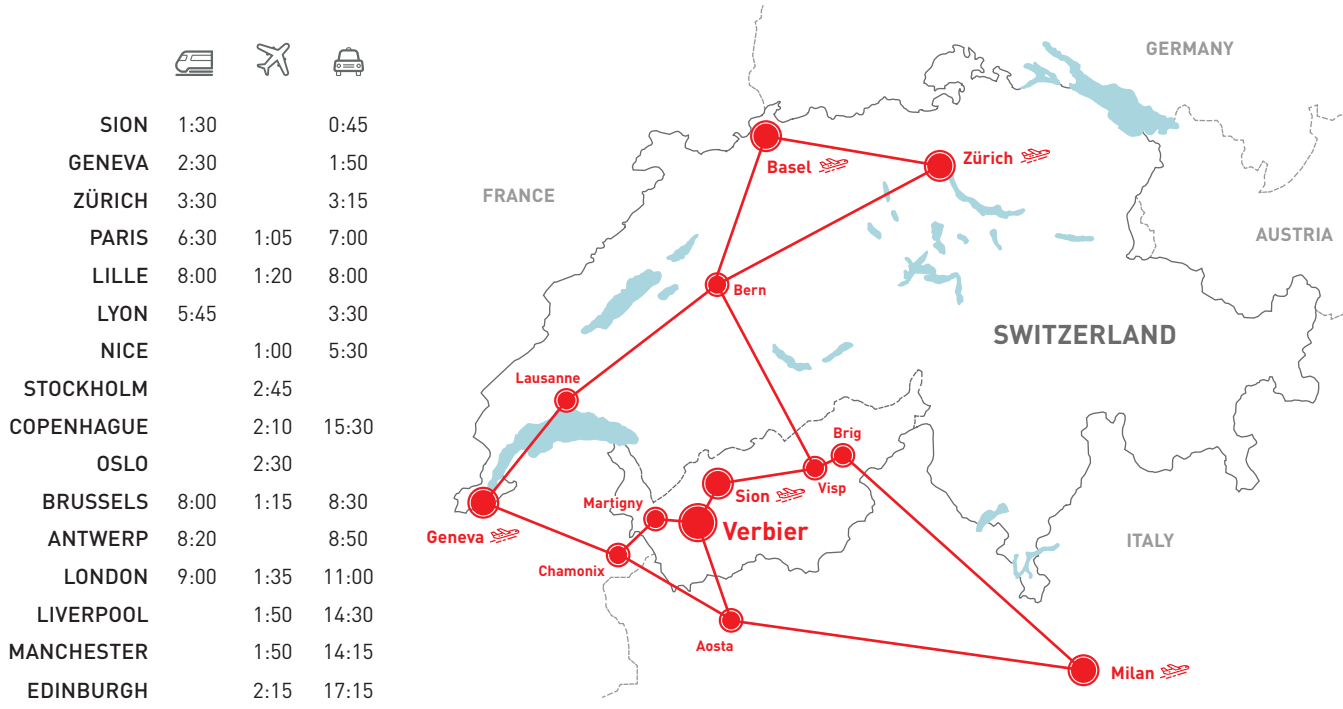

By gondola

The Le Châble - Verbier lifts, which are now integrated into the public transport system, have extended their operating hours to 5:15 AM to 11:50 PM daily.

By bus

– In Verbier, shuttle buses run free of charge every day from 8 am to 8 pm all winter long. Night buses start running at 8 pm on certain dates throughout the season.

– In Les Mayens-de-Bruson, from mid-December to the beginning of April, free shuttle buses run every day from 8.30 am to 6.30 pm.

By train

The regional train from Martigny station to Le Châble takes 25 minutes. To improve comfort for passengers, the service frequency has been increased to every 30 minutes in the morning and evening.

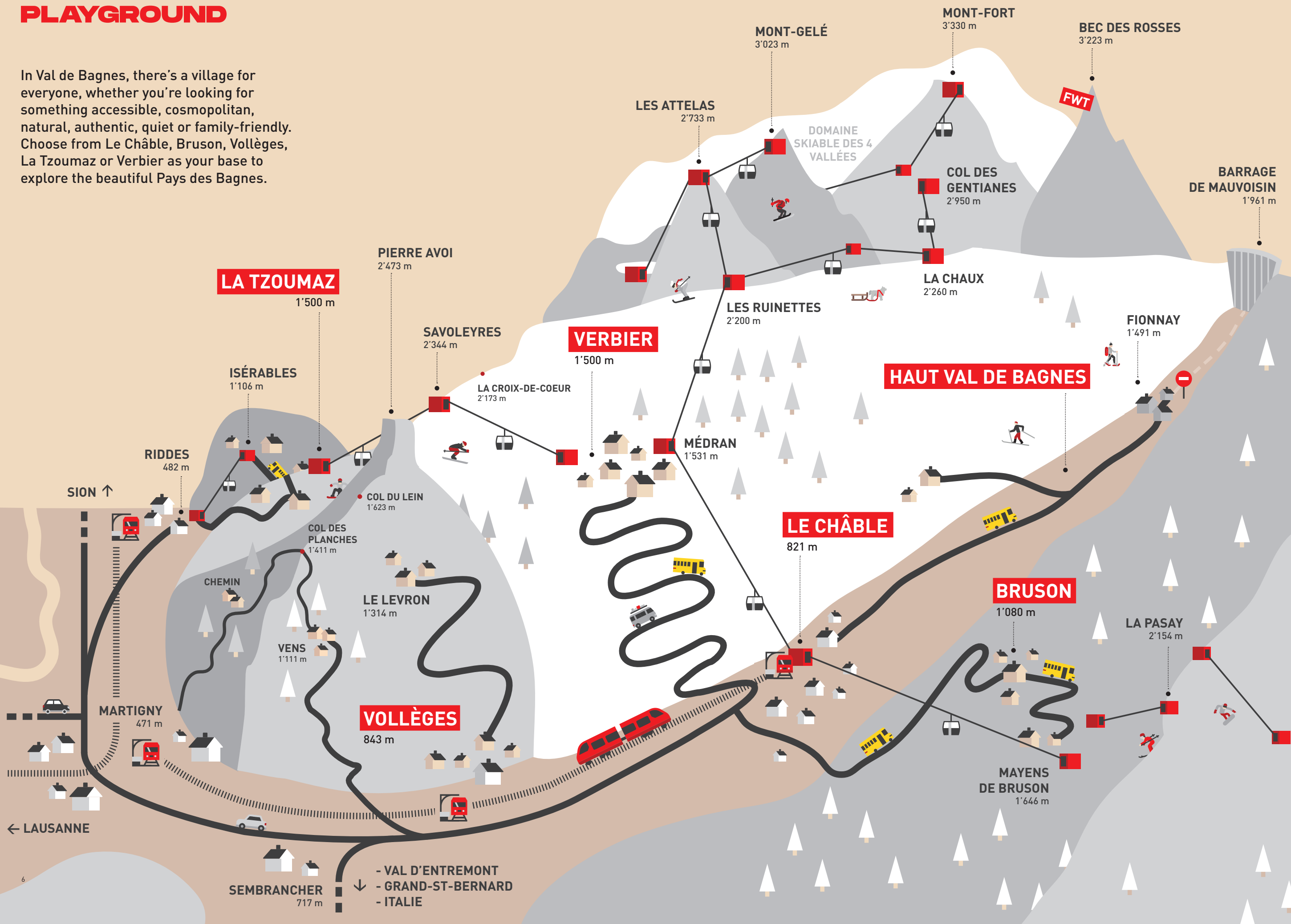

RIDE, BUT MAKE IT VERBIER



PORTRAIT: JUSTIN MURISIER – THE QUEST FOR THE PERFECT TURN

Born and raised in Val de Bagnes, Justin Murisier has been a prominent figure on the World Cup ski circuit for more than a decade. From his early days navigating the Pasay run in Bruson to mastering the legendary Streif in Kitzbühel, this skier from Prarreyer has conquered the most challenging routes in the skiing world. Despite his global fan base celebrating his triumphs, Justin holds a deep connection to his home valley, saying: "Verbier offers a unique blend of vibrant resort life and the valley's traditional charm." While Justin appreciates the tranquillity of the Upper Val de Bagnes and its nature reserve, it's the slopes of Verbier that truly excite him. He highlights that apart from its freeride reputation, the meticulously maintained slopes in the resort are among the world's most breathtaking. Of particular significance is the Attelas run, which played a pivotal role in his victory as the Swiss Downhill Champion in 2023.

VERBIER 4VALLÉES

The largest ski area in Switzerland - the 4Valleys - unites six resorts: Verbier, La Tzoumaz, Bruson, Nendaz, Veysonnaz and Thyon, creating a playground of 410 km of runs (24 blue, 39 red and 10 black) all connected by 80 ski lifts. From 1,250 m to 3,330 m (summit of Mont-Fort), with breathtaking views from the Matterhorn to Mont-Blanc, the area is a paradise for all skiers and snowboarders, for all skill levels from beginners to pro riders. From pristine slopes to thrilling off-piste itineraries, Verbier 4Vallées has built up an international reputation as a legendary destination for any skier.

SKI LIFT OPENING DATES

The ski season in Verbier lasts an impressive six months. From November 2023 until April 2024, skiers can enjoy the slopes. At the start of the season, ski lifts operate on week-ends only (Saturdays and Sundays), then from the first week-end of December, they run non-stop (seven days a week) until the end of April 2024.

VERBIER RACE EXPERIENCE

This winter, skiers and competition fans can enjoy a dedicated race area at the top of the La Tzoumaz - Savoleyres sector. With a state-of-the-art timing system and an exhilarating giant slalom course featuring around 15 gates, it's open to everyone. Whether you're competing with friends or on your own quest for speed, it's the stopwatch that decides the final outcome.



FIRST TRACKS

The adventure starts as Verbier wakes up. While even hardcore skiers have yet to put on their boots, the lift staff are already hard at work preparing for another day on the slopes. That's where your assigned ski patroller comes in. With them, you'll have the privilege of making the first tracks on the freshly groomed Attelas piste before the first skiers reach the area. As the sun begins to rise, the piste will be completely yours for two runs. Afterwards, refuel with a mountaintop breakfast before exploring the rest of Verbier and the 4 Valleys.

FREERIDE ITINERARIES: POWDER BLISS IN COMPLETE SAFETY

A true freeride paradise and a pioneer in the field, Verbier 4Vallées was one of the first resorts to make large areas of virgin powder snow safe. As a result, there are now 11 freeride itineraries throughout the resort marked out by the ski patrol and safeguarded from the hazards of the mountains. Freedom, sweeping turns and movie-perfect snow are all within easy reach on routes shown with a yellow line on the piste map and by yellow and orange poles on the ground. A mountain guide is still strongly recommended.



NEW L'INKONTRO

This winter, the legendary Chalet Carlsberg is being reinvented and transformed into L'Inkontro, a warm place rooted in the cultural identity of the Bagnard region and infused with the warmth and flavours of the Mediterranean, a place where old meets new. Inspired by recently renovated mountain huts like Chanrion, the architecture preserves the original structure by enveloping it with a modern layer, propelling it into the 21st century. On entering Inkontro, you're immediately drawn into its warm atmosphere. Every detail harmoniously blends both tradition and innovation. At the crossroads of Verbier's major slopes, L'Inkontro (which literally means "I'm going to meet you" in local Val de Bagnes dialect) isn't just a bar or restaurant, it's a place where skiers of all generations can mix, connect and share their experiences.

THE LEGENDARY MONT-FORT PUB

Visitors party here with pints in hand and ski boots on, but they often miss the historic charm of this Verbier setting. While the Mont-Fort Pub is recognised as a local treasure, its rich history remains less well known. The tale begins in 1927 when the Mont-Fort guesthouse opened its doors on the path to Cabane Mont-Fort (2,457 m), which was built two years earlier when ski lifts were non-existent in Verbier.

In 1977, fifty years after the guesthouse's establishment, the Mont-Fort Pub made its home within the same walls, seamlessly blending with Verbier's changing landscape. However, its core essence hasn't faded; instead, it has flourished. Known affectionately as «The Pub,» it has gained a reputation, both regionally and globally, for its renowned après-ski. On its resort-centred terrace, skiers and freeriders from varying eras converge during lively après-ski hours, creating a vibrant ambiance that makes the Mont-Fort Pub legendary.

THE TEMPLE OF APRÈS-SKI

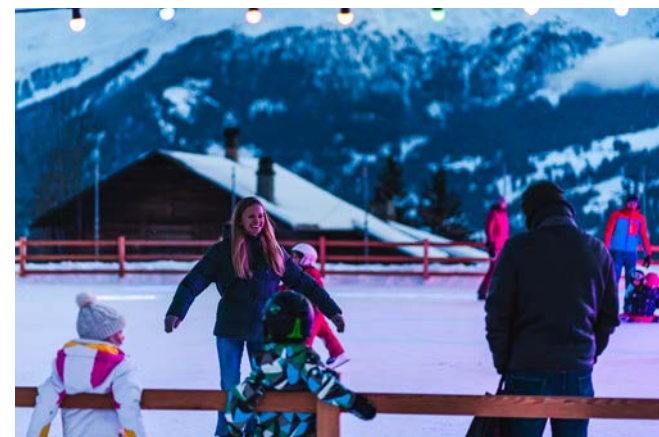
Renowned globally for its vibrant and cosmopolitan nightlife, during winter, Verbier's iconic après-ski bars and dynamic nightclubs come to life. And the best part is, you can party hard without changing out of your ski boots. Swap the slopes for the dance floor in just one move, and soak up the atmosphere at these go-to venues. Start your adventure at classic Verbier hotspots like the Mont Fort Pub, Le Rouge, Le Fer à Cheval and don't miss out on the live bands at Farinet. The festivities carry on at the legendary Farm Club, a 40-year-old institution, and extend into the early hours at South nightclub.

FEEL LIKE A KID AGAIN

Get ready for an exhilarating adventure on the La Tzoumaz toboggan run, an electrifying experience suitable for everyone, whether professional or not. Start your journey from the summit of the Savoleyres cable car (2,354 m), where jaw-dropping vistas of the Grand Combin and the Rhône Valley await. Feel the rush as you speed down the 7 km track, descending a staggering 711 m in altitude, a sure way to get your heart racing. Wearing a helmet is advised. Hire toboggans in resort or at the top of the run in Savoleyres.

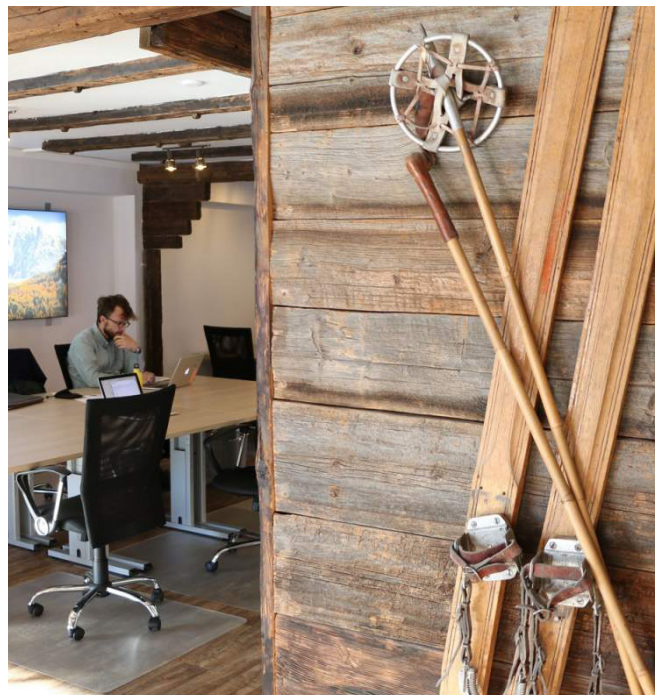

MAARTEN VAN GEEST: A NEW VISION FOR MOUNTAIN REGIONS

A regular visitor to Val de Bagnes since he was a child, Maarten Van Geest, a Dutchman with a passion for the region, which he describes as "the most beautiful in the world", moved here in 2011 and has since started a family. A man of many contacts, he enjoys forging new links with people: "Being a foreign resident has enabled me to rub shoulders with both local entrepreneurs and new start-ups via the coworking space I founded." Well aware of and persuaded by (having succumbed to the temptation himself) the quality of life and infrastructure that the region has to offer, Maarten van Geest became the first business development officer for the Val de Bagnes municipality. "I liked the challenge offered by the council, because the job is part of a drive to boost the economy. Today, I want to help all the entrepreneurs who would like to develop their operations in the commune. My door is always open to them."

According to Maarten, the region is particularly well-suited to remote working and telecommuting, with good connections to the Lake Geneva region "in less than two hours by public transport, with a high-performance internet network that offers connection conditions similar to those in urban centres." And of course there's the quality of life: "Our region, or rather our paradise, is the ideal place to combine work and pleasure thanks to our natural environment and infrastructure," says Maarten. "It's definitely enough to motivate entrepreneurs to develop their businesses here," he hopes.

Convinced that "economic development goes hand in hand with sustainable development", he intends to incorporate both into his new role. "This is especially true for a mountain region that depends on tourism for its livelihood. But we can't rely solely on winter sports to ensure the valley's prosperity over the next ten, fifteen or twenty years. Val de Bagnes needs to diversify. One of the challenges will be to move towards a more circular, sustainable economy, one that is better distributed throughout the year, and that promotes local supply chains. A fine challenge for this accomplished sportsman!"

GOOD DEALS: OUR TIPS FOR AN AFFORDABLE STAY

If you follow a few simple guidelines, you can enjoy all the atmosphere and services Verbier has to offer, but at much more affordable prices:

- Look at more than one area of the destination for somewhere to stay: you're never very far from the slopes or from public transport wherever you choose.
- Book directly with the hotel: you'll often find better deals and prices than through booking sites.
- Buy ski passes at least 10 days in advance and online, and a 10% discount is automatically applied. What's more, additional discounts apply during less busy periods.

Add to that, attractive accommodation deals outside the high season (Christmas, New Years Eve and February) in a chalet or an apartment, and you've got a winter holiday in Verbier that's far more affordable than you might have expected.



B&B - RIDE INN IN VERBIER

Less than a five-minute stroll from the ski lifts, the Ride Inn B&B holds a prime position in the heart of Verbier, with restaurants, bars and shops all within easy reach. The chalet offers seven bedrooms, accommodating up to 13 guests. Inside, an expansive open-plan living area, a fully-equipped kitchen, and a welcoming dining space create a shared dining experience. And for those who prefer to have the space to themselves, the property is available to rent for private use only.

SUSTAINABLE VERBIER



QUESTIONS TO LAURENT VAUCHER, DIRECTOR OF TÉLÉVERBIER



What is the environmental impact of skiing and what are you doing about it?

The operation of our ski lifts generates very little CO₂. This is because we use electricity from low-carbon sources, such as hydroelectric power. The biggest carbon footprint comes from the movement of customers from their place of residence to the ski resort. To reduce the carbon footprint of skiers, we have increased alternative ways of getting around by promoting rail transport (for example, the Verbier Express) and by

extending the operating hours of the Le Châble-Verbier cable car. This means that anyone who wants to get to Verbier early in the morning and leave again late in the evening can do so by using public transport.

During each construction phase, we carry out a series of offsetting measures that are agreed with the canton of Valais and the Confederation to minimise the impact on flora and fauna.

What are Téléverbier's future plans in terms of sustainability? How far do you want to go?

We aim to achieve net-zero carbon emissions and generate our own electricity. While we still produce carbon emissions from our snow-grooming vehicles, the technology for replacing internal combustion engines is not yet perfected. However, projects based on electric batteries or hydrogen fuel cells are well advanced and we expect to see a solution on the market in the mid-term. By then, we will have reached zero emissions.

In terms of electrical energy production, we have launched a study to identify all the ideal spots for installing solar panels or other clean technologies on our land. This will help us to safeguard ourselves against the impact of possible energy shortages and increase the production of green energy.

THE COMMUNE OF VAL DE BAGNES OUTLINES ITS ENVIRONMENT PLAN

Marie-Luce Duroux-Barman, Quality Manager, and Corinne Dettwiller, the Sustainability Officer of the commune of Val de Bagnes, tell us about the environmental challenges the municipality is facing and the action it is taking to address these issues.

How is the Commune of Val de Bagnes tackling environmental issues?

Two years ago, we put together a sustainability team consisting of leaders and managers from the administration. Starting in July 2023, we welcomed a sustainability delegate to lead this group, fostering collaboration across all departments.

From a political standpoint, the local council is deeply committed to putting sustainability at the top of our agenda. Our legislative program outlines actions taken and planned in six key sectors, like tourism and the environment.

Internally, we've taken action too. We introduced guidelines for eco-friendly purchasing and earned ongoing certifications, like the esteemed «Cité de l'énergie» label.

What are the key initiatives you have already undertaken?

We've already rolled out a number of significant initiatives. One major focus is providing grants to residents and businesses, encouraging the adoption of sustainable energy practices such as electric transportation, improved insulation, and environmentally friendly heating. But we haven't stopped there. We're also supporting mountain farming by distributing vouchers to our residents to buy local food.

When it comes to energy, we've taken an innovative approach by establishing Energithèque, in collaboration with our partner ALTIS. This is a one-stop shop for residents seeking to reduce their environmental impact. Within this platform, experts offer customised guidance and assistance. One of our programs is «My Community and Me». Spanning seven months, a dedicated specialist assists local households in evaluating their carbon footprint and pinpointing methods to decrease it through adjustments in housing, transportation, and dietary decisions.

How important is tourism to the local authority's sustainability strategy?

Tourism is the main issue for Val de Bagnes with one of our main priorities being transportation. We're collaborating with partners like TMR and TéléVerbier on a strategy that covers both travelling to and within the resort. To connect to Verbier, the «Verbier Express» links Geneva to Le Châble directly during the winter. The Le Châble-Verbier cable car is now integrated into the public transport system with varied schedules. Locally, we introduced a complimentary shuttle service and a ski school meeting point accessible only by shuttle. This has helped alleviate congestion in the mornings.

One area that's less publicised, we've developed a program for local hotels, focusing on cutting down food waste and offering complimentary bio-waste collection from the catering sector. We're also partnering with real estate agents and

property managers to promote building renovations, focusing on Verbier due to its significant energy-saving potential, where local authority grants are readily available.

What is the region's situation in terms of electricity production and consumption? What about the water supply? Is there anything you can do?

Altis holds the responsibility in this domain, a company jointly owned by municipalities in the region, including Val de Bagnes. They provide the area with water, electricity and heat. Electricity consumed within the municipality, including Verbier, is fully sourced from renewable energy, primarily through hydroelectric production. When it comes to heating, Verbier has a smart setup with a carbon-neutral district heating system powered by wood pellets. It currently serves about 700 buildings, and has resulted in significant savings on heating oil.

Water conservation is always on the agenda too. Thanks to Altis' innovation hub, Blueark Entremont, we're always brainstorming clever ways to make the best use of our water. One standout project is Odile, which is giving local farmers a hand in using less water while boosting their crop yields.



MEASURES TAKEN BY THE SKI AREA

With the environment very much top of everyone's agenda, the Téléverbier ski lift company has introduced a number of measures to minimise the impact of winter sports and tourism on the natural surroundings.

Leaving no aspect unaddressed, Téléverbier is actively working on various fronts. This includes ski lifts, snow grooming, snowmaking, transportation, building management and energy usage. The company is dedicated to improving energy efficiency and minimising its carbon footprint. For instance, the majority of the electrical energy used by Téléverbier is sourced from hydroelectric production in Valais. They have reduced the operating speed of ski lifts to conserve over 10% of energy and extend the lifespan of machinery. Additionally, they employ state-of-the-art snow cannons for mechanical snowmaking, producing high-quality snow with less water and energy compared to older models. These are just a few examples from a long list of measures, all contributing towards a more environmentally conscious mountain environment.

• Cabane Brunet

The Cabane Brunet mountain hut is a cosy refuge at an altitude of 2,100 m. It was built in 1930, but was swept away by an avalanche in 1937, then rebuilt in 1942. The hut is now run by Jean-Marc Corthay. Jean-Marc is known for his sunny disposition and love of his work, and he spoils his visitors with delicious local specialities. The refuge is accessible on foot, by snowshoe or by ski touring, and is a great place to rest and refuel before scaling the legendary Mont Rogneux, which climbs to 3,084 m.

SKI TOURING THE ROGNEUX

Here's a suggestion for a ski touring weekend combining both sport and relaxation: start your workout from the car park at La Barmasse and follow the trail that climbs through the forest. Halfway up, you reach a small clearing where you can stop to take in the views of the surrounding mountains, such as the imposing Mont-Pleureur, sitting at the bottom of the Bagnes valley. Once you've soaked up the scenery and caught your breath, continue through the forest to reach a snow-covered road with a gentler slope leading to the mountain hut at an altitude of 2,100 m. After all that hard work, comes your reward - a delicious meal at the Cabane Brunet hut, prepared by the Corthay family, with one of their traditional dishes, including Grandma's famous apple pie. Get some sleep in one of the six rooms of this newly refurbished refuge. The next morning, have a hearty breakfast and then climb even higher to reach the Col du Rogneux. From here, more experienced skiers can continue to the summit of the Rogneux via the ridge.

For those who prefer something a little less challenging, enjoy a picnic lunch at the foot of the Combins massif - a welcome treat before making your way back down to the Barmasse car park via the off-piste itinerary.

Day 1: Barmasse - Cabane Brunet:

2-hr climb 7 km - 750 m D+.

Day 2: Cabane Brunet - Col du Rogneux:

2-hr climb 5 km - 750 m D+ (approx. 45 min. ascent / 600 m and 200 m D+ to reach the summit)

MONT 4 ZIPLINE

From Mont-Fort (3,330 m), the highest zipline in the Alps hits speeds of 130 km/h over 1.4 km with a 383 m drop - these numbers alone are enough to make you dizzy. This massive winter challenge awaits the bravest, as they fly over the Tortin glacier on the zipline.

SPEND A NIGHT OUT

It takes either a very hectic day or a certain poetic flair to think about heading off into the mountains for some ski touring under the stars. On select evenings each week, those drawn to nocturnal ski touring can select from three attractive routes departing from either Verbier, La Tzoumaz or Bruson. Why only on particular nights? To allow the slopes to be groomed later than usual so that hikers can ascend and descend in complete safety, while avoiding meeting piste bashers. OBJECTIVE 4000: THE GRAND COMBIN

Standing tall at 4,314 m, the legendary Grand Combin is a must-do for any skier or mountaineer. This two-day tour begins with a ski tour from Fionnay to the Panossière hut (1,100 m of elevation gain, 3 hrs). After a restful night, the real challenge begins: scaling the Corbassière glacier and tackling the couloir du Gardien. As you near the summit, tension builds and crampons replace skins for the final ascent (1,700 m of elevation gain, 6 hrs). But once you reach the top, the views are simply breathtaking. Descending through pristine wilderness, you'll feel a sense of accomplishment and satisfaction that only comes from conquering a mountain. This is a challenging tour, but it's also an unforgettable one. Skill level: Good to excellent. Little mountaineering experience required.

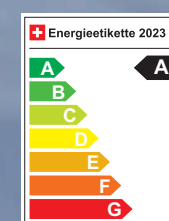
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
